There is evidence to assume that legal intercourse between different classes of provincial populace was more intensive than commonly assumed in scholarly literature. Focused on the period before the Constitutio Antoniniana, a response of Scaevola is introduced regarding a Greek parakatastheke inter vivos but employed in inheritance context (D. 32.37.5 18 dig.). Upon the paradigmatic case it can be argued that the 'choice of law' was not only based on status, but also on personal considerations, even among Roman citizens in a provincial environment. - Réponse de Bernhard Palme.
