Macedonian governments in the early Hellenistic period played an important role in adapting traditional structures of the poleis to their own needs. One notable example is the dissemination of the institution of nomophylakes, typically an oligarchic position of lawkeepers, in many cities that had not adopted them until the second half of the 4th century, especially in newly founded cities. The traces of this influence are particularly evident in the documentation of the Ptolemaic kingdom.
