Previous scholarship has observed that the occurrence of  $\mu$ έν without a corresponding  $\delta$ έ (so-called  $\mu$ έν solitarium) is not an uncommon phenomenon in Post-classical Greek, including non-literary papyri. It has been suggested that such instances are best captured by considering them "elliptically antithetical" ("prospective"). Shows that when it comes to the papyri,  $\mu$ έν can be found in other contexts, too. Explains the relatively frequent appearance of  $\mu$ έν solitarium by relating it to the semantic and syntactic extension of the  $\mu$ έν ...  $\delta$ έ construction in the post-classical period. Concludes by drawing attention to the importance of taking into account social context when describing such a grammatical feature.

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
