The act of declaring properties for taxation and other objectives was not a novel concept in Egypt prior to the ascension of the Ptolemaic dynasty. Nevertheless, the Ptolemies developed this practice and broadened its scope to encompass nearly all aspects of life during their reign. The process of registering properties was overseen by the state officials through the anagraphai, while individuals were mandated to submit their own declarations, known as apographai.
