Explores the ancient concepts of exactitude with reference to ancient medicine and medical dosage. After a general introduction about the ancient ideas of proportional and balanced exactitude, discusses the dichotomy and the overlapping between standard or theoretical measures and material containers, used in medical practice - beside the indications of approximate quantities - as expressions of a practical know-how that adapted the ingredients to modify the efficacy of the medicament or in accordance to the patient's individual needs.
