This issue is addressed mainly on the basis of two papyrus fragments from the imperial age [P. Oxy. XXII, 2331 (= MP3 1931; LDAB 5363); P. Köln IV, 179 (= MP3 2916.3; LDAB 4706)]: they both display vignettes interspersed with portions of Greek text that contain the words spoken by the characters appearing in each vignette, who set up an agonial parodic contrast centred on the labours of Herakles.
