

Nikos Litinas, Relative Pronouns in Greek Papyri.

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Various papyrus documents demonstrate two syntactic structures that have been extensively discussed in the grammars of Greek papyri dated to the Ptolemaic, Roman, and Byzantine periods. These structures include the substitution of the relative pronoun with the article and the phenomenon of the attraction of the relative pronoun. Offers updated examples of these linguistic phenomena and shares observations regarding their use in everyday language. The textual evidence illustrates how these structures interact with particular verbs, providing clearer insight into their limited application within private documents.

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
